

2-1-1 Vaccine Scheduling Resources

- Call 2-1-1 for the State COVID Helpline for assistance in scheduling an appointment
- ONLY for individuals who meet both of these criteria:
 - 1) 65+ or 16+ with two or more medical conditions (co-morbidities)
 - 2) Unable to use the internet to schedule an appointment online
- Not a shortcut to an appointment; call takers use vaxfinder.mass.gov
- Book primarily at mass vax sites; limited ability to book at other sites
- If no appointments available, will be offered a place on a callback list for the mass vax sites when appointments become available. It is a long list -it may take several weeks to be called; first come, first serve
- Can NOT assist with 2nd dose appointments
- Open Monday-Thursday 8:30 am-8:00pm; Friday-Sunday 8:30am-5:00pm
- English, Spanish; access to 100+ other language interpreters

Preregistration for Vaccine

The Commonwealth's preregistration system makes it easier to request and schedule an appointment at one of the mass vaccination locations. Eligible people can preregister for vaccine only at mass vaccination locations.

- Sign up to be notified about appointments at mass vaccination sites
 - Go to www.mass.gov
 - Select tab at top right of page COVID-19
 - Select "COVID-19 vaccine" under the Table of Contents
 - Select Box "Preregister for a COVID-19 vaccine appointment"
 - Select "How to preregister" under the Table of Contents
 - Select Box "Preregister for a mass vaccination location"

- Add your name to the list
- Get notified when an appointment is available. Once notified, you'll have 24 hours to accept the appointment and book it.
- Mass vaccination locations include:
 - Gillette Stadium (Foxboro),
 - Former Circuit City (Dartmouth),
 - Hynes Convention Center (Boston)
- Due to constrained federal supply, it will take several weeks to be notified about available appointments
- If you do not have access to the internet, you have three (3) options for assistance in preregistering -use whichever you prefer:
 - Call 2-1-1
 - Contact the Board of Health at (774) 872-0941
 - Contact the Commission on Disability at (774) 872-0924
 - Information required: Name, address, date of birth, contact information, preferred method of communication (phone, email, or text), information about eligibility (living situations, medical conditions, occupations)

Vaccine for Homebound Individuals

- The Dighton Board of Health is registering Homebound individuals to receive the COVID-19 Vaccine
- The COVID-19 Vaccine is being distributed by the State In-Home Vaccination Program
- Contact the Board of Health at 774-872-0941
 - Board of Health will determine if the individual meets the eligibility requirements.
 - Board of Health will register the individual for the State In-Home Vaccination Program
- Homebound is defined as someone who needs an ambulance or assistance from at least 2 people to get to a routine medical appointment
- It may take several weeks for an in-home appointment to be available
